American Psychological Foundation (APF) Mission and Funding

APF provides financial support for innovative research and programs that enhance the power of psychology to elevate the human condition and advance human potential both now and in generations to come. It executes this mission through a broad range of scholarships and grants. For all of these, it encourages applications from individuals who represent diversity in race, ethnicity, gender, age, disability, and sexual orientation.

The American Psychological Foundation's Henry David Fund was established to support young psychologists with a demonstrated interest in the behavioral aspects of human reproductive behavior or an area related to population concerns. Its description, application requirements and procedures appear below.

APF supports original, innovative research and projects. Although APF favors unique, independent work, the Foundation does fund derivative projects that are part of larger studies.

Description

The American Psychological Foundation's Henry David Fund was established to support young psychologists with a demonstrated interest in the behavioral aspects of human reproductive behavior or an area related to population concerns. The fund sponsors two grants annually:

- The Research Grant provides up to \$1,500 for support of ongoing research in behavioral aspects of population studies or human reproductive behavior.
- The Travel Grant provides up to \$1,500 to support travel related to research on human reproductive behavior and population studies or attendance at an international or regional congress.

Individuals may apply for one or both grants.

Program Goals

- Encourage and enhance the development of talented graduate students and early career researchers
- Support graduate students and early career researchers in attending an international or regional congress
- Support travel related to research on human reproductive behavior and population studies

Funding Specifics

- Research Grant: up to \$1,500 annually

- Travel Grant: up to \$1,500 annually

We do not allow indirect costs to be taken out of grant monies, although applicants can use grant monies for stipend support and other administrative costs (software, materials, etc.). Our policy on this is as follows, from the grant terms and conditions document:

No Institutional Indirect Costs. The entire grant must be provided to the individual grantee for the stated purpose. The grant may not be used to pay institutional indirect costs or overhead. If funds will be administered by the grantee's institution, the institution must affirm in writing that it will waive all administrative fees and charges for indirect costs. This assurance may be provided through the signature of a responsible official on this agreement. This assurance must be received before the funds can be released.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicants must be graduate students conducting dissertation research or early career researchers with not more than seven years postgraduate experience
- Demonstrated interest in human reproductive behavior or related population concerns
- Open to applicants in all relevant disciplines who have a demonstrated psychological approach to their work, with preference given to psychologists

Proposal Requirements:

- Completed application form
- One to two page detailed research plan
- Current CV highlighting relevant experience
- Two letters of recommendation
- One to two page essay demonstrating an active interest in human reproductive behavior or in population studies
